# A WORLD CLASS EDUCATION WITH THE WORLD IN YOUR CLASS

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The Nova Scotia International Student Program (NSISP) has been offering an unparalleled public education and English immersion experience to international students since 1997. Nova Scotia's public education system is one of the best in the world and prepares students for continued success in post-secondary training, which 93% of NSISP graduates pursue. Nova Scotia is known as "Canada's Education Province" with 10 universities, more per capita than anywhere else in Canada.

Students are accepted from grades 4-12 (ages 8-18), and can choose to study for a semester, full-year, or ESL summer camp. NSISP students can choose from a wide variety of subjects within the Nova Scotia curriculum and their credits are transferable to their home country. The NSISP believes in fully integrating students into the schools they attend and program policies limit the number of international students from one country to five students per school. This ensures all NSISP participants have a truly Canadian academic experience.

## NSISP STUDENTS WHO GRADUATE IN NOVA SCOTIA RECEIVE THE FOLLOWING BENEFITS TO NOVA SCOTIAN UNIVERSITIES:

Guaranteed university admission with an average of 70% on required courses.

Guaranteed waiver of the TOEFL (or equivalent) exam for university applicants with 70% or higher in Nova Scotia grade 12 academic English (or equivalent).

Guaranteed scholarship to students with an average of 85% or higher.

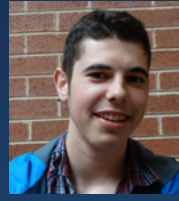
